Goal	LEARN NC User Tip
Locate activities that incorporate best practices and diverse strategies.	Use Guided Search (home page) options like " <i>I need a strategy for teaching my students about...</i> " or " <i>I want to improve my teaching of...</i> " to find best practice articles and innovative lesson plans
Locate websites relevant to my subject that students can use on their own.	Use Guided Search (home page) option " <i>I want my students to work independently on...</i> " to find relevant websites
Locate developmentally appropriate websites relevant to my grade.	Use LEARN NC for Students grade-specific pages.
Locate online projects, interactive websites and data for classroom use.	Use Best of the Web and browse by subject and grade level.
Locate material that includes content and skills in multiple subject areas.	Browse Lesson Plans by grade, select subjects to narrow search.
Locate lessons designed to teach and assess North Carolina's curriculum.	Use Standard Course of Study to locate resources aligned by goal and objective.
Locate resources using two or more terms. (a narrow, specific search)	Use Search page to search for all words or by exact phrase.
Locate definitions for education terms and acronyms.	Use Education Reference and related resources for additional information.
Locate field trip opportunities relevant to my curriculum.	Use Discover NC to find local destinations and related lessons or websites.
Locate professional development opportunities online.	Use Online Courses to see current workshop offerings.
Access resources developed by DPI consultants.	Use Most Requested Resources drop down on homepage to find NCDPI Division of Curriculum and School Reform.
