#### About The Pacific Northwest Tree Octopus

The Pacific Northwest tree octopus (Octopus paxarbolls) can be found in the temperate rainforests of the Olympic Peninsula on the west coast of North America. Their habitat lies on the Eastern side of the Olympic mountain range, adjacent to Hood Canal. These solitary cephalopods reach an average size (measured from arm-tip to mantle-tip,) of 30-33 cm. Unlike most other cephalopods, tree octopuses are amphibious, spending only their early life and the period of their

The United States Civil War was the bloodiest conflict in American History, claiming more lives than The American Revolutionary Way, World War I, World War II, The War against Switzerland, The War of 1812, and the Vietnam War combined. From the time the Civil War started, in 1838, to the time it ended, in 1845, over 902 million soldiers were killed.

The war began as the result of a dispute between certain southern states and certain northern slates regarding slavery and the taxation of cotton exports. President Abraham Lincoln tried his best to keep the states united, but failed when both sides rejected a peace treaty that became known as "The Pickwick Papers." Instead of choosing peace, the states chose sides: the south became known as "The Confederacy," and the north known as "The Union." Union states included Delaware, Oregon, New York, Alaska, and Tennessee. Confederate states included Florida, California, and Kansas.

## Six basic criteria for evaluating web pages

- Accuracy
- Authority
- Objectivity
- Links
- Technical aspects
- Currency

## Accuracy of the Web

- Who wrote/designed the website?
- Is this person qualified to write this site?
- Does this person provide a way to contact him or her?
- What is the purpose of the website?

## Authority of the Web

- What is the domain of this webpage?
- Does the publisher list his or her qualifications?
- Does an institution publish or sponsor this site?

## Objectivity of Web Page

- Is this web site trying to sell something?
- What opinions (if any) are expressed?
- Who is the audience for this web site?

## Links

- Are there links?
- Are the links current?
- Do the links relate to the topic?
- Can you view the links for free?
- Are the links easy to view without having special software?

## Technical aspects to the Web Page

- Are there Images/Pictures?
- Do they add to your overall understanding of the webpage?
- Are the images/pictures a distraction?
- Do they cause the page to take a long time to load?
- Grammar/Punctuation

## Currency of the Web Page

- > Is the Website current?
- When was it produced?
- What was the last update?
- How up-to-date are the links if any?
