### Highlighted Lesson Plans

- **Are you on a diet?** -- <http://www.learnnc.org/lp/editions/proud-diet/6728>  
Grade 4. Part of the Kenan Fellows edition titled "I'm on a diet and proud of it: Nutrition through math and science." This activity will expose students' background knowledge, beliefs, and misconceptions about diets, and allow them to re-frame their thinking through focused word study and discussion. In the end, students will understand diet as a multi-faceted concept.
- **Mountain dialect: Reading between the spoken lines** -- <http://www.learnnc.org/lp/pages/2807>  
Grade 8. This lesson plan uses Chapter 13 of Our Southern Highlanders as a jumping-off point to help students achieve social studies and English language arts objectives while developing an appreciation of the uniqueness of regional speech patterns, the complexities of ethnographic encounter, and the need to interrogate primary sources carefully to identify potential biases and misinformation in them. Historical content includes American slavery, the turn of the century, and the Great Depression.

Grades 9-12. This lesson for high school will help students to distinguish between satire and parody. Students will analyze several examples of both satire and parody and will work in groups to plan and create their own examples of satire. Teachers are encouraged to use blogging and VoiceThread technology to enhance student interaction.
