Narrator

Villager #1

I cannot afford to pay my taxes! They are too high and unfair!

Villager #2

We will never have enough food or clothing because the taxes are so high!

Narrator

The Chief of the Tlaxcaltecas became weary of this oppression and wanted to help his people. He decided to fight for the people's freedom. The chief had a daughter named Iztaccihuatl who fell in love with the most handsome of her father's warriors. And it was on this day that the Chief gave the young couple his permission to marry.

(enter Princess and Warrior)_

Warrior

I am so happy that your father has given us permission to marry! We will defeat our enemies and live a long and prosperous life!

Princess

And I will be waiting for your return from the battle. I will think of you everyday and wait for your return.

Narrator

Villager #2

Narrator

Villager #1

Narrator

(Warrior wanders back and forth)

Warrior

I am going to build a great tomb under the sun in honor of my princess so that she will never be forgotten!

Narrator

The warrior ordered a great tomb built under the sun, piling up ten hills together to form a huge mountain. He carried the Princess in his arms and took her to the summit and laid her on the great mountain. He took a smoking torch and knelt in front of this beloved to watch over her eternal sleep.
