## Emily's 2013 Reading Challenge

This year's challenge is geography based; you must read books set on each continent. Each book from the same continent must be set in a different country. (Example: if you read a book set in England, your other books for Europe must take place in countries other than England.)To qualify, a large portion of the book must take place in that country. If there is significant travel across several countries within the same continent, that can count as one book for that continent. (Example: backpacking across Europe where time is spent in several countries, no one more than the others.)

Any book that is not a 32-page picture book counts: intended for any age group, graphic novels, audiobooks, fiction, nonfiction, biography, etc. (If you are a parent and the only way you can participate is to count picture books you read with your child, I'm okay with that, too!)

To complete the challenge, you must read a total of fifteen books; thirteen books from section A and two books from section B.
