
Nancy W. Darden Child Development Center Art Wall




My Brother's Book by Maurice Sendak – the last book completed before Sendak's death in 2012




Jemmy Button by Alix Barzelay an easy story book about a boy from South America


Fog Island by Tomi Ungerer - a German story




Jane, the Fox and Me by Fanny Britt – a graphic novel
