

#### **JOYNER 3D PRINTING STUDIO**

The 3D printing studio in Joyner Library was very successful during the 2018-2019 academic year. A total of 587 patrons utilized the studio, and approximately 251 3D models were printed using our services. Thirty-six 3D printing classes/ demon-strations were taught to ECU faculty, staff, students, and local K-12 students from the IMAGINE-NC Project and the ECU MIS STEM Camp for Girls.

While we offer instructional sessions on 3D printing for groups, we also provide consultations for individual faculty, students, and staff. Since we no longer have "open studio" hours due to a shortage of faculty and staff, consultations are by appointment only.
